**Advisory Council on Historic Preservation to Hold September 17th Public Meeting
on Navy's CERCLA Removal Action for Hangar 1, Moffett Field**

WHAT: The Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) will hold a public meeting September 17, 2008 at 7:00 p.m. at the Hahn Auditorium in the Computer History Museum, 1401 N. Shoreline Blvd., Mountain View, California. The purpose of the meeting is to gather public input on the Navy's preferred removal action alternative and its effect on the historic integrity of Hangar 1 and solicit ideas for measures or conditions on this action that would avoid, minimize, or mitigate the potential adverse effects to the hangar. Hangar 1 is individually eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places and a contributing element of the National Register listed U.S. Naval Air Station Sunnyvale, California, Historic District. Following the meeting, the ACHP will provide its comments to the Secretary of the Navy by October 6, 2008.

WHO: The Navy and the public will have an opportunity to address the ACHP.
