ABOUT THE WORKSHOP SPEAKERS

DAVID P. WESSEL, AIC, FAPT: Principal of Architectural Resources Group based in San Francisco whose services include architecture, historic architecture, sustainable design, conversation, planning, historical research and materials conservation. In his presentation, Wessel will review the various types of wood deterioration and treatments, as illustrated by a number of projects including Doc Ricketts' Lab on Cannery Row in Monterey.

JOHN GRISWOLD: Chief Conservator and Principal of Griswold Conservation Associates, Los Angeles. His topic will be his company's efforts to preserve the stone façade and sculpture of the Royal Presidio Chapel in Monterey.

ROY TOLLES, P.E., PH.D.: Structural engineer and President of ELT Associates, Oakland. His talk is entitled "Simplified Seismic Retrofitting for Adobes" and will include a brief overview of his three decades' worth of research and design work performed on damaged adobe buildings including Casa de la Torre and Casa Abrego in Monterey, the Castro Breen Adobe in San Juan Bautista, and Rios Caledonia Adobe in San Miguel, CA.

NANCY GOLDENBERG, LEED, AP:

Architectural Historian & Consultant, Principal of Carey and Co., an award-winning architectural firm in San Francisco. Her talk will focus on conservation efforts on behalf of two wood and masonry houses built at the Nevada Test Site that were subject to a 30 kiloton nuclear blast. The effects were then studied to determine how best to construct houses to withstand nuclear attack.
