RESOLUTION OF RECOGNITION El Dorado County Historical Museum

WHEREAS, the El Dorado County Historical Museum, committed to preserving and interpreting the history of El Dorado County and to serving as a historical resource for residents and visitors alike, has sought, first and foremost, to establish professional standards for its exhibits, collections, and research facility; and

WHEREAS, the El Dorado County Historical Museum has, in the past year, enjoyed the assistance of 81 regular volunteers, who spent approximately 16,500 hours inventorying and cataloging artifact and research collections, organizing general history files and the museum's large collection of scrapbooks, and updating and enriching the research capabilities of the museum website; and

WHEREAS, the El Dorado County Historical Museum is a dynamic institution, refining collections, solving problems, and making plans, as resources and manpower become available, for a County Railroad and Logging Museum, exhibits to attract greater numbers of third and fourth graders, and to make accessible to researchers a collection of early court records; therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the State Historical Resources Commission recognizes the great strides taken by the El Dorado County Historical Museum as it evolves and grows in its capacity to interpret the past and educate the citizens of El Dorado County and, at the same time, create a sense of community among the County's history-related groups and urges all to visit and enjoy its many attractions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be recorded in the minutes of the State Historical Resources Commission and a suitable copy presented to the El Dorado County Historical Museum.
