## RESOLUTION OF RECOGNITION

### City of Sacramento

**WHEREAS**, the City of Sacramento has, through policy development and program implementation, maintained a historic preservation program, most recently embodied in the Historic and Cultural Resources element of the City's award-winning General Plan, designation as a Preserve America Community, and creation of an independent Preservation Commission, and;

**WHEREAS**, implementation of preservation policy has resulted in adaptive reuse, rehabilitation, and restoration of historic buildings by the private sector, in conjunction with the City of Sacramento, bringing investment, vitality, and energy to Sacramento's historic neighborhoods, and;

**WHEREAS**, the City has in recent years adopted two new historic districts, the Central Shops District and the Oak Park District, and numerous individual landmarks, provided review of demolition requests for potentially historic buildings, and worked to survey, identify, and adopt new historic districts and landmarks, and;

**WHEREAS**, stewardship of City-owned historic properties has resulted in their restoration, preservation and adaptive reuse, including Memorial Auditorium and Historic City Hall, a project that integrates the historic building with a modern expansion, and commemorates the ancient Nisenan village of Sa'cum that once occupied the site, and;

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that official recognition on behalf of the State Historical Resources Commission is given to the City of Sacramento for their ongoing commitment to historic preservation, and;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution be recorded in the minutes of the State Historical Resources Commission and a suitable copy presented to representatives of the City of Sacramento.
