RESOLUTION OF RECOGNITION City of Auburn

WHEREAS, in 1966, Congress declared in the National Historic Preservation Act that the federal government, in partnership with the state and local governments, shall "foster conditions under which our modern society and our prehistoric and historic resources can exist in productive harmony"; and,

WHEREAS, in 1948, California Historical Landmark #404, City of Auburn, was established, and in 1970, the Historic Old Auburn District was added to the National Register of Historic Places through the efforts of the Placer County Parks & Historical Restoration Commission, both actions establishing the importance of this Gold Rush era community to California history; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Auburn has worked to preserve and restore its historic buildings, including the Placer County Museum in the Auburn Courthouse, the Bernhard Museum Complex at the Traveler's Rest, and the ongoing restoration projects of Auburn Fire House No. 1 and Fire House No. 2; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Auburn has worked with community organizations including the Native Sons of the Golden West, coordinated volunteers from the Placer County Contracts Association, and worked with the Placer County Museums Division to promote the annual countywide "Heritage Trail" tour program and Downtown Auburn self-guided walking tour; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that official recognition on behalf of the State Historical Resources Commission is given to the City of Auburn for its ongoing historic preservation efforts; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be recorded in the minutes of the State Historical Resources Commission and a suitable copy presented to representatives of the City of Auburn.
