RESOLUTION OF RECOGNITION Placer County Museums Division

WHEREAS, since 1984 the mission of the Placer County Museums Division has been to serve the public and promote community involvement through heritage education, preservation of historic artifacts and the county's rich historic and cultural legacy, and adding to the understanding of Placer County, its people, places and events; and,

WHEREAS, the Museums Division currently manages six museums, including the Gold Country Museum established in 1948, the Placer County Museum, the Bernhard Museum Complex in Auburn, the Griffith Quarry Museum in Penryn, Forest Hill Divide Museum, Golden Drift Museum in Dutch Flat, and a County Archives and Research Center, a collections management facility of over 30,000 artifacts; and,

WHEREAS, the Museums Division carries out their mission through their Living History, School Tour, and Community Education programs, their annual countywide Heritage Trail program coordinating special events and tours of 18 museums in Placer County, and guided tours of Old Town Auburn; and,

WHEREAS, the Museums Division also reviews Placer County projects to determine their effects on cultural resources, and offers comments to the Placer County Department of Planning regarding these resources; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that official recognition on behalf of the State Historical Resources Commission is given to Placer County Museums Division for its ongoing curatorial, interpretive, preservation and cultural resource management efforts; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be recorded in the minutes of the State Historical Resources Commission and a suitable copy presented to representatives of Placer County Museums Division.
