RESOLUTION OF RECOGNITION

City of Palm Springs

WHEREAS, Congress declared in the National Historic Preservation Act that it shall be the policy of the federal government, in partnership with the state and local governments, “to foster conditions under which our modern society and our prehistoric and historic resources can exist in productive harmony”; and,

WHEREAS, the National Park Service and State of California through the Office of Historic Preservation, California State Parks, has established the Certified Local Government program to carry out this policy; and,

WHEREAS, the program recognizes local governments which have legislated a preservation program, including a qualified cultural resources commission which identifies and designates significant cultural resources to be protected for future generations and which advises the city council on actions which affect these resources; and,

WHEREAS, on August 28, 2014 the City of Palm Springs has been approved by the State of California and the United States Department of the Interior to be a Certified Local Government;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the State Historical Resources Commission and the State Historic Preservation Officer invest with the City of Palm Springs all the responsibilities and benefits of certification; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be recorded in the minutes of the State Historical Resources Commission and a suitable copy presented to the City of Palm Springs.
