**ADDITIONAL DETAILS ABOUT PUBLIC COMMENTS:** Please note that when considering comments related to nominations for designation, the Commission can only consider evidence that pertains to whether or not a property meets the criteria for listing in the National Register of Historic Places, the California Register of Historical Resources, or the California Historical Landmarks/Points of Historical Interest programs. The Commission cannot consider social, economic, or environmental considerations when determining if a property meets applicable registration criteria.

**The order of comments for nominations will proceed as follows:** The Commission will first hear from the nominator or his/her/their designee. The nominator or his/her/their designee will have ten (10) minutes to speak. The Commission will then hear from the property owner(s) or his/her/their designee. Each property owner or his/her/their designee will have ten (10) minutes to speak. Individuals representing local, state, federal, and tribal governments, will each have five (5) minutes to speak. Any member of the general public will have three (3) minutes to speak.

Those providing comments related to other matters not pertaining to nominations will each have three (3) minutes to speak.
