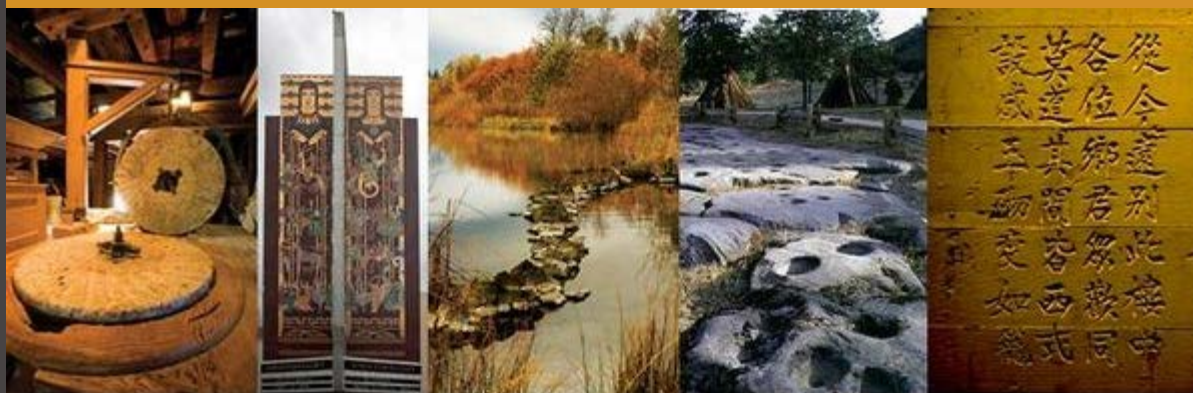

##### Petroglyph Recovery and Restoration

The Bishop Paiute Tribe has established an Assessment and Restoration Fund following the desecration and removal of six petroglyph panels from volcanic cliffs north of Bishop, California. The petroglyphs were carved into the rocks thousands of years ago and are sacred to the Paiute and Shoshone people. To learn more about the restoration effort and to

### **Honoring Cesar Chavez and the Farm Labor Movement**

This past month, the National Park Service submitted to Congress the NPS' "Cesar Chavez Special Resource Study," evaluating "the significance and suitability of sites significant to Cesar Chavez and the farm labor movement," for inclusion in the national park service system. The NPS studied approximately 100 sites and considered five alternatives with regard to management and administration.

The final recommendation was for a national historic park that would include five sites significant to the life of Cesar Chavez, and to the farm labor movement. Each site also met national historic landmark criteria (McDonnell Hall requires further research to assess NHL eligibility):

- Forty Acres National Historic Landmark, Delano, CA
- Filipino Community Hall, Delano, CA
- Cesar E. Chavez National Monument at Nuestra Senora Reina de La Paz, Keene, CA
- Santa Rita Center, Phoenix, AZ
- McDonnell Hall, San Jose, CA
