Julia Morgan Awarded the AIA Gold Medal



On December 12, 2013, renowned architect, Julia Morgan, was posthumously awarded the American Institute of Architects' Gold Medal, recognizing the scope, influence, and value of her work to the built environment of America. Julia Morgan was the first licensed female

architect in California, and graced the state's architectural landscape with works of enduring importance and individuality. Ms. Morgan's life and work have been an inpiration to generations of architects, especially the many women who followed her into the profession. Preserving Latino Heritage in San Francisco

San Francisco Heritage, and the San Francisco Latino Historical Society joined forces in 2013 to begin a series of projects documenting and preserving the city's Latino history, particularly the 24th Street neighborhood in the Mission District. The first community-based project involved local college and high school students in the development of a walking

tour of 24th Street. A bilingual, self-guided walking tour booklet - "Calle 24: Cuentos del Barrio" -was published, and student-led tours were a part of the Mission District's "Sunday Streets" event in July 2013. A second project, due this year, will be the production of a citywide historic context statement documenting Latino history within the physical and cultural landscape of San Francisco.
