## **Preserving California's Latino History**

The Office of Historic Preservation is currently developing a historic context about Latinos in California during the twentieth century and preparing a Multiple Property Documentation Form to facilitate National Register of Historic Places nominations. The California-focused study dovetails with the National Park Service's American Latino Theme Study, which is a broader, nationwide endeavor.



The OHP welcomes public participation in helping to identify places that are important in the life and history of California's Latino

communities. Sites may be important for a variety of reasons such as labor history, community activism, arts and entertainment, social movements, or residential or commercial development. Public feedback will be used to compile a list of properties potentially eligible for the National Register of Historic Places.
