Background

The California Office of Historic Preservation (OHP) is updating the Statewide Historic Preservation Plan (State Plan). The State Plan is required as a condition of the National Park Service (NPS) grant received from the federal Historic Preservation Fund. While a federal requirement, the Plan is a valuable tool for discussing and developing our state's vision and values to preserve our diverse and extensive cultural and historical resources.

In creating the State Plan, OHP is engaging the public through listening sessions, surveys, and other input opportunities over the next several months. This Listening Session is an opportunity for attendees to provide their input about historic preservation goals and objectives for the state of California. The State Plan will result in a report for the years 2028-2032 and is scheduled for completion in December 2027.
