CLG ANNUAL REPORT OCTOBER 1, 2019 through SEPTEMBER 30, 2020 DUE APRIL 30, 2021

Reminder 1

Since 2011, OHP has expanded the annual report to include information that OHP forwards to the National Park Service on behalf of he CLGs. The reports are similar, but different: OHP collects information related to how the CLG program is working; NPS gathers products information, i.e., numbers of properties designated, etc.

To make it easier for the CLGs in California we have combined the two reports into one. CLGs no longer are required to provide products information directly to NPS; the OHP will provide that information on your behalf.

Reminder 2

In the National Park Service section, many of you have been checking "no", that you do not have a Local Register and "no", that you do not have a design/regulatory program. In California, you must have a local register or designation program and an ordinance in order to become a CLG. So check "yes."

Reminder 3

In order to compete for a 2010-2022 CLG grant, you must have submitted your annual report for the period October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2020 by no later than April 30, 2021. That is a firm date.

Reminder 4

Submit the report in electronic form only. If possible, scan any attachments.
