Millerton Lake State Recreation Area is located where the San Joaquin River flows out from the Sierra Nevada foothills and into the Central Valley. The 319-foot-tall Friant Dam was built across the river canyon in 1944 to form Millerton Lake State Recreation Area.

Millerton Lake State Recreation Area offers a wide variety of recreational opportunities, including fishing, boating, swimming, hiking, bicycling, and kayaking. Trails range from the short ¼-mile interpretive trail at Fort Miller Campground to the 14-mile San Joaquin River Trail. Don't forget your binoculars—our landscape is home to a wide variety of birds, including the majestic bald eagle!
